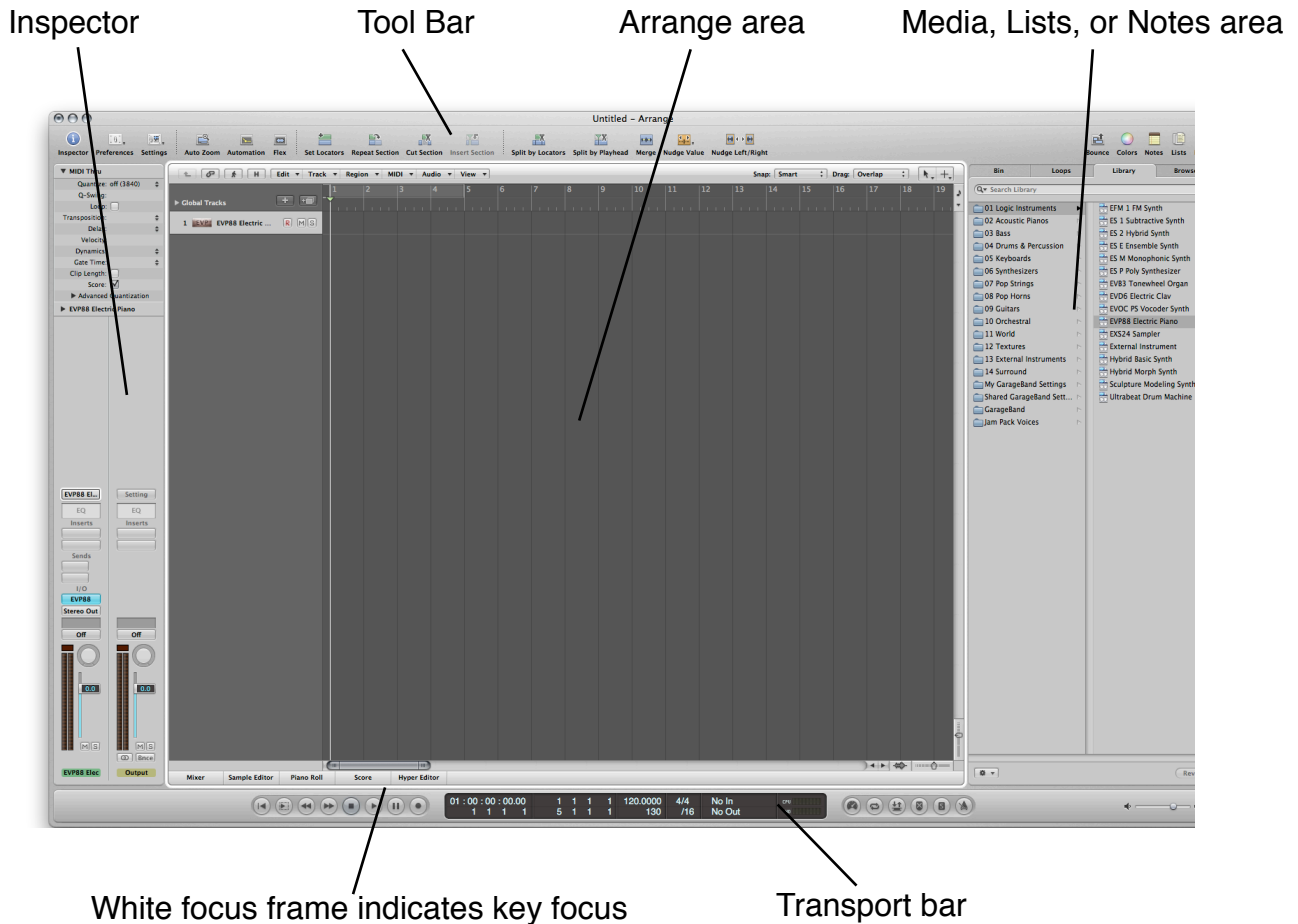


Cheatsheet 1: Intro to Logic

Layout



Shortcuts to Remember

(Note: we are using the US layout which is optimized for laptops and keyboards without an extended numerical pad. You can choose a ProTools layout or even customize it to your own specs by choosing Logic Pro > Preferences > Key Commands (then in the Key Command window, choose Options > Preset > [item])

- Go to beginning: Return (if this doesn't work, use the function key [fn] and Return key at the same time.)
- Rewind: <
- Forward: >
- Fast Rewind: Shift-<
- Fast Forward: Shift->

- Play or Stop: Spacebar
- Record: R

Setting up Cycle Mode

Clicking and dragging in the Bar ruler sets a green area which will cycle; click outside of the green cycle area (but still in the Bar ruler) to turn it off (or click the cycle button in the transport bar)

Two Best Friends

- command-S
- command-Z (by default, Logic remembers the last 30 steps of your work)

Copying/Adjusting a Region

- Option-drag copies a region and allows you to quickly place it elsewhere in the project.
- Hover the cursor in the top right corner to make the cursor turn into a loop tool.
- Hover the cursor in the bottom right corner to make the cursor turn into a resize tool.
- You can manipulate how regions repeat using the command Region > Repeat Regions (or press Command-R)
- Select a region and press L to quickly set it to loop.

Zooming

- Select a track header or region, then press Z to quickly zoom in on it.
- Control-option-drag around an area also zooms in.
- Horizontal zoom of arrange area: Option-Control-Left or Right Arrow
- Vertical zoom of arrange area: Option-Control-Left or Down Arrow
